


Schoolhouse Activity Packet



Average 19th Century School Day

- Woke up and walked miles to school
- School started around 7:00 am
- Entered the school house and said <u>morning prayer</u>
- Then stood for <u>roll call</u> (attendance)
- The teacher might then have given students jobs like <u>collecting</u> <u>firewood</u> or <u>sweeping</u>
- The first class was <u>reading and</u> <u>writing</u>
- The second class was geography
- By mid-day the children were let out for <u>recess</u>
- After recess was spelling
- And lastly was <u>arithmetic (math)</u>
- Class was then dismissed and the students stayed behind to help their teacher clean up
- When all was done, the children began their long walk home

Teachers had to deal with large class sizes of all age groups, all under one roof. This made it challenging for the teacher to be able to fully teach each student to the best of their abilities.

- Wake up and say <u>morning</u>
- prayers
 For the Jay family, it was a short walk to the school house which was on the property (the teacher is already waiting for the Jays)
- The first class might have been <u>arithmetic (math)</u>
- The second class might have been <u>reading and writing</u>
- The third class might be <u>geography</u>
- Next was <u>recess</u> outside on the Estate
- After recess might have been <u>spelling</u>
- And lastly, a class might have been French, Latin, or drawing

Certain classes like foreign language and drawing are unique to the Jay home. Because of their wealth, they were able to hire a school master or teacher who could give them a more personalized and well-rounded education.

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- The second class was <u>geography</u>
- By mid-day the children were let out for <u>recess</u>

- And lastly was <u>arithmetic (math)</u>

- When all was done, the children began their long walk home

School days often lasted 10 hours and were in one room schoolhouses that lacked electricity and running water. Multiple grades were combined in the one room. Also, there were no bathrooms to use except for the outhouse outside!

- Wake up and catch the bus to school
- School started around 8:45 am
- Enter school and recite the <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>
- The first class might be <u>math</u>
- The second class might be <u>music</u>
- The third class might be <u>art</u>
- Next is <u>recess</u> outside
- The fourth class might be reading and writing
- The Fifth class might be geography or social studies
- School is dismissed in the late afternoon

School days often last 6 1/2 hours and are in buildings with electricity, heat, and indoor bathrooms. Classes are taken with the same grade.

Each one of your fingers represents a virtue


Your thumb stands for <u>kindness</u>
