

Albany August the 20<sup>th</sup> 1860

Antislavery office No 10 Tank st

Mr Wm Jay esq sir

The two fugitives arrived here that you sent  
and I sent them immediately on their rout  
for Canada in this month we have had ten  
we have sent on the two that you sent sir <sup>they</sup> had  
some money they said that you gave them some  
they had enough to get to Canada but <sup>the other</sup> had none  
Mr Myers is not home he is at Lake George this  
Season as Butler and you see sir I have to attend  
to the fugitives myself I was very thankful that  
you gave some aid for it was on Saturday they came and  
it would have been difficult to get money to send them  
on that day and it <sup>is</sup> hard to get money for the fugitive for  
it seems that Prejudice against our class grows stronger  
every day and yet we have a few good friends that feel for <sup>the</sup>  
Bleeding slave that comes panting at their doors  
I thank you for all the favours you have done for the  
Down trodden that come to this office may God bless  
you sir and your Posterity yours for the Oppress
